A retreat for Freshman & Sophomores

On Saturday, December 2, the Office of Faith Formation is holding another Christ's Light in All Youth (CLAY) retreat. The retreat begins at 9:30 am, ends at 8:00 pm and will take place at the All Saints parish, Wichita.

CLAY is a retreat for freshmen & sophomores and is based on Jeremiah 18:1-6. We explore images of clay and light as we focus on teen years as a time of formation, of being molded into ever more perfect vessels for the light that is Christ in us. The attendees make a clay candle holder, watch a live potter at work, and hear some talks to help them take a deeper look at themselves and what their life is centered on. The retreat includes a penance service in the afternoon and the retreat ends with a Mass that the participants' families are invited to attend.

Altruism: Good for Both of You By Chris Ebberwein, Ph.D.

When on earth, Jesus proclaimed that he desires us to have a joy in him that "might be complete" (Jn 15:11). In word and deed, he also taught us to love one another. The parable of the Good Samaritan is just one example of Jesus' instruction to live a life in service to others. Since Jesus does not contradict himself, a life of loving one's neighbor must also be one of joy and abundance in God's plan.

Consistent with our faith, Positive Psychology shows that altruism has benefits not only for the receiver of a kind act, but for the "do-er" of the act. Some social scientists have surmised that altruism is just another side of selfishness, for example by relieving feelings of guilt or through gaining recognition. We again see the consistency when recalling that Jesus warned us of this very thing: "When you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right is doing" (Mt 6:3).

As Christians, we know we have to ward against the pride that can come from "doing good." According to the saints, true charity is always sacrifice, but God has designed a world where sacrificial love results in positive emotional health on the other side of the good act. Research shows that doing five acts of kindness each day has lasting effects on positive emotion. This research is consistent with one part of depression treatment that encourages individuals to do something good for others, as a way to see beyond the current state of melancholy. We might ask ourselves: In my parish, who could benefit from a visit, a card, a meal, a kind word, or a ride to Mass or a parish event? When we make the sacrifice, the reward will go both ways.
